1. Introduction

3. Policy Statements

- 3.1. SEN definition. In this policy, special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) is defined as:
 - 3.1.1. A pupil or young person with a learning difficulty or disability which calls for special educational provision to be made for them.
- 3.2. A pupil has a learning difficulty or disability if they:
 - 3.2.1. have a significantly greater difficulty in learning than the majority of their peers of the same age, or
 - 3.2.2. have a disability which prevents or hinders them from making use of facilities of a kind generally provided for others of the same age in mainstream schools.
- 3.3. Many children and young people who have a SEN may also have a disability under the 2010 Equality Act.
- 3.4. Children and young people with a disability do not necessarily have a SEN, but there is a significant overlap between disabled children and young people and those with SEN.
- 3.5. Where a disabled child or young person requires special educational provision they will also be covered by the SEN definition in this policy (SEN C of P 2015 page 14/15/16/17).

4. Implementation

- 4.1. The Governing Body has delegated the responsibility for the implementation of this policy through written procedures to the Executive Headteacher and named staff.

5. Review

- 5.1. The governing body reviews this policy annually.
- 5.2. The governors may, however, review the policy earlier than this, if the government introduces new regulations, or if the governing body receives recommendations on how the policy might be improved.
